FELLOW, CARMET PROGRAM – DEPARTMENT OF OBSTETRICS & GYNECOLOGY - AD/2/65/21 (2 POSTS) (CHS)

The Program

The CARDMET program facilitates capacity building to address the burden of cardiometabolic risk factors and diseases in low- and middle income countries. The University of Nairobi and the University of Washington, Department Of Global Health (DGH) has been funded by the Fogarty International Center of the National Institutes of Health to offer educational training at Masters level to qualified individuals from Kenya to focus on CVDs and their risk factors.

The Fellowship

This is a 2-year training program that will consist of one-year training to complete coursework at the University of Washington (UW) Department of Global Health (DGH) in Seattle, WA. The second year will be completed at the home country (Kenya) in which a research project will be conducted to fulfill the degree's thesis requirement. This training will result in a Master in Public Health (MPH) degree from UW DGH.

Minimum Qualifications

- Hold a Master's degree, a doctoral degree (Ph.D., D.Phil.), or a professional degree (M.D., J.D., D.V.M., etc.) from a regionally accredited college or university in the U.S. or its equivalent from an accredited foreign institution.
- An unofficial transcript of degree must be submitted for application to the fellowship program.

Grade Point Average (GPA)

- Have earned at least a 3.0 grade-point average (on a 4 point scale) from a regionally accredited college or university in the U.S. or its equivalent from a foreign institution for the last 90 graded quarter credits or 60 graded semester credits from a baccalaureate degree (for a Masters, doctoral, or professional degree, the total cumulative average may be used).
- If you earned additional credits from an accredited institution after your degree, you may include these credits in calculating your GPA.
